Garlic Harvest - July

Attendees: Rhizome - Michael, Celine, Melanie, Charlotte Melanie and Charlotte filmed night harvest of garlic

Farm Ops:

Trees: donated by VA farm, Amy, Madalyn

Trees from VA did not do well, red currants, red bud and one paw paw survived

Success with swamp white oak, river locust, bitternut hickory, American hazelnut. Stock sourced locally seems better suited.

Planted rootlings in swales constructed in 2021, built air pruning bed, watered seedlings during drought, installed protective fencing.

Existing orchards: poor production from apples, plums, cherries. Cane crops okay: black, white and red raspberry, strawberries, currants produced some fruit. Pruning during winter.

Mushrooms:

Expanded log inoculation piles, excellent yields of inoculated and mycorhizzal species. Perfected method for sunning, dehydrating, powdering and packaging mushrooms. Tested inoculation in bags for indoor cultivation: good yields of pioppino, oyster, and chestnut.

Vegetable, herbs:

Starter plants donated by Tovey, Amy

Yield: good production of asparagus, garlic, spinach and squash. Tomatoes moderate due to early frosts.



FF:

Mamoun - visited twice, once to drop off willow stock from Syracuse with rented truck. Returned for a week and built one and a half living structures.



Andy and Emily - visited regularly throughout the grow season, created new planting beds, grew herbs, tobacco, and added many flowering plants. Mowing and helped with repairs on house, built trellises and planter boxes.
